

| <b>Year group</b> | <b>Planned CEIAG activities</b>  |
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| Year 7            | Students cover teamwork skills, entrepreneurship and stereotypes as part of their Life Learning lessons. They also attend a workshop from a visiting author who talks about their career. In addition to this all Year 7 students attend a workshop delivered by Zoolab which discusses careers involving working with animals.  |
| Year 8            | Students are supported through the GCSE options process and receive help with this from both their subject teachers and tutors. Life learning lessons also cover the important employability attributes of public speaking and self confidence. All Year 8 students attend a workshop delivered by Born Free, an international charity, which discusses careers involving charity work.  |
| Year 9            | Students cover the topics of enterprise and entrepreneurship in Life Learning lessons. In addition to this all subjects link curriculum learning to careers by delivering lessons in April that discuss the potential careers the subject can lead to and the employability skills it can give young people. Finally, all Year 9 students attend The Big Futures Show: an opportunity for students to meet with a wide variety of further education and training providers plus prospective employers from across the region. PDT sessions before and after the show prepare students to make the most of the visit and help them to reflect on what they have learnt. |
| Year 10           | All Year 10 students are taken in lessons to the Uckfield College Careers Fair, which has over 30 exhibitors including local employers, training providers, further education colleges and local universities. Year 10 students also complete a week's work experience in term 6 and PDT sessions before and after their work experience prepare students to make the most of the week and help them to reflect on what they have learnt.  |
| Year 11           | Students are supported through the post 16 options process and receive help with this from both their subject teachers and tutors. All students are taken on a university visit to learn more about Higher Education. All Year 11 students are taken in lessons to the Uckfield College Careers Fair, which has over 30 exhibitors including local employers, training providers, further education colleges and local universities.   |
| Year 12           | Students complete a variety of online employability courses, such as Futurelearn's 'How to Succeed at Interviews'. All students take part in an interview skills day, led by the EY Foundation, where they get to meet a wide variety of working professionals. All level 3 students attend the local UCAS University and Apprenticeship exhibition.   |
| Year 13           | Students complete a variety of online employability courses, such as Futurelearn's 'How to Succeed at Writing Applications' Students are encouraged to visit university open days and are given assistance with UCAS applications. Students not wishing to go to university are given assistance applying to apprenticeships, employment and other colleges. All students attend a talk on careers and part time work in outdoor activities.   |

In addition to these activities all year groups may attend the annual Uckfield College careers fair at either break or lunch when it is on and a wide variety of visiting speakers come into curriculum lessons and assemblies throughout the year.
